Community Outreach

El Cerrito Police Officers hosted two community events in April. On April 7, Officers hosted pizza in the evening with community members at Mountain Mike's Pizza while they discussed crime trends in El Cerrito. On April 13, from 6:30 to 8:30 in the morning, Officers hosted a "Coffee with the Cops" event at Peet's Coffee to discuss automobile burglary prevention with commuters and other early risers.

National Night Out on August 6, 2019

The Police Department encourages our community members to begin registering their block parties, if they plan to participate at el-cerrito.org/nno. National Night Out is an annual event that combines neighborhood block party with crime prevention discussions with ECPD Officers. Community members who host parties on National Night Out may receive special benefits such as free street closure permits and/or visits by McGruff the Crime Dog.

Electric Parking Enforcement Vehicle

During the week of April 8 through April 12, police employees evaluated an electric parking enforcement vehicle. Each of our Community Service Officers had a chance to drive the vehicle and learn about the features. Although the technology has come a long way, the consensus among the evaluators was that the vehicle would not fill the needs of the department. The Police Department remains on the lookout for an electric alternative to our current parking enforcement fleet.

Reserve Officers

The El Cerrito Police Department's Reserve Officer program has a long history of service to the City of El Cerrito. Reserve Police Officers are volunteers who either ride with full time Officers or work alone. The ECPD currently has 2 Reserve Officers. In addition to patrol duties, Reserve Police Officers assist in a variety of capacities. They take prisoners

to the county jail, provide security at major crime scenes, patrol on bicycles, and assist the SRO's with events at the schools. In 2018, Reserve Officers donated 436.20 service hours to the ECPD.

PUBLIC WORKS

Public Meeting on Recycling Market Impacts

Tuesday, April 30, 7-8:30 p.m., City Council Chambers

As reported in the last City Manager's Update, bans on materials in international recycling markets have created unprecedented disruptions for recycling programs throughout the United States. With market disruptions continuing, the City has recently received notice from its recycling processor that the company will need to start charging a fee to cover costs of processing recyclables from the City's curbside program. Staff is currently investigating all available options and alternatives to maintain stable rates for customers, while ensuring the materials are diverted from the landfill. We anticipate bringing the results of this research, including any potential rate increases, to City Council in late spring. Volunteers Help Restore Habitat at the Recycling + Environmental Resources Center

Since early this calendar year, Operations + Environmental Services Division (OESD) staff have been working with the local volunteer group *Greens at Work* to remove invasive plants on the hillside directly above the Recycling + Environmental Resource Center, which forms part of the Hillside Natural Area. Volunteers have pulled a large amount of invasive plants from the area, including french broom, arundo donax, thistle, and even some pampas grass. Opening the area has encouraged some of the existing native plants to thrive, including willow, california poppy, purple needlegrass, and mugwort. A report and pictures of the work have been published in the April 2019 newsletter of the East Bay Chapter of the California Native Plant Society (ebcnps.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/04/April-2019-Bay-Leaf-d.pdf).

Greens at Work has secured donations of pots of native grasses, which they plan to plant in the fall. OESD staff applied for a small grant from Contra Costa County Fish and Wildlife Propagation Fund to purchase materials and plants. Grant awardees will be announced in early summer 2019. The intention of the project is to reduce invasive weeds on the hillside; remove dead, dry, flammable green waste; and to encourage native California plants and the wildlife that favor them for food and habitat.

Alameda County Transportation Commission's San Pablo Ave. Corridor Project Update

As reported in the last News & Views Spring 2019 Newsletter, the Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) is conducting an on-line survey (available at

bit.ly/sanpabloave-survey and hosting a series of public workshops to obtain the public's input on the San Pablo Ave. Corridor Project. The project seeks to develop a long-term vision and near-term improvements for San Pablo Ave. to improve mobility, efficiency and safety for current and future users while supporting a strong local economy and communities. This multi-year effort spans from Downtown Oakland in the south through the City of San Pablo in the north.

The project is currently at the conceptual design stage. The ACTC team has taken a detailed look at what can fit within the existing roadway and identified what the trade-offs are between different types of improvements. Several options have been developed for how the space on San Pablo Ave. could be used differently in the future.

Because multiple public agencies are responsible for ownership, operations and maintenance of the Project area, ACTC asked each participating agency to approve a Project Charter to memorialize commitments to work cooperatively. In March 2018, the City Council authorized the City Manager to execute a Project Charter with ACTC, as the sponsoring agency, and the seven cities along the 4-mile long corridor (Oakland, Emeryville, Berkeley, Albany, El Cerrito, Richmond and San Pablo), Caltrans, and AC Transit, and designated a City Council member to serve on the Project Policy Advisory Committee. Since that time, City staff have been actively participating in the Technical Advisory Committee and stakeholder outreach efforts.

PG&E Community Wildfire Safety Outreach

The Community Wildfire Safety Program implements additional precautionary measures to further reduce wildfire risks following the 2017 and 2018 wildfires.

Over the next month, all PG&E electric customers will be receiving a letter or an email letting them know that, as a last resort, they may need to turn off power for safety when extreme fire danger conditions are forecasted. A copy of the letter is attached

RE: Important Message: Take Action Today to Prepare for Possible Public Safety Power Outages

Dear Valued Customer:

Given the growing threat of extreme weather, we want all of our customers to be prepared for potential power outages. If extreme fire danger conditions threaten a portion of the electric system serving your community, it may be necessary for us to turn off electricity in the interest of public safety. This is called a Public Safety Power Shutoff.

What you need to know about Public Safety Power Shutoff

We want all our customers to understand why it may be necessary for us to shut off electric power during times of extreme wildfire risk.

- Before any Public Safety Power Shutoff, we carefully review a combination of criteria such as predictions of strong winds and very low humidity levels, along with critically dry vegetation and on-the-ground observations from field crews.
- Because the energy system relies on power lines working together to provide electricity across cities, counties and regions, your power may be shut off, even if you do not live or work in an area experiencing high winds or other extreme weather conditions. This is done to ensure the safety of all communities and customers.
- If we need to turn off your power, we will attempt to contact you in advance by phone, text and email, and provide updates through social media, local news, radio and the pge.com website.
- We expect to be able to restore power to most of our customers within 24 to 48 hours after the extreme wildfire risk ends. We urge our customers to prepare for longer outages lasting 2 to 5 days in case equipment needs to be repaired or other actions are needed to ensure public safety.

How to better prepare

We know how much our customers rely on electric service and want to work together to help you prepare for potential power outages related to extreme weather or wildfire threats. Here are some important steps you can take today:

- **Sign up for alerts by visiting pge.com/mywildfirealerts or call 1-866-743-6589** during normal business hours to update your contact information. We will use this information to alert you through automated calls, texts and emails, when and where possible, prior to a Public Safety Power Shutoff.
- **Plan for medical needs** like medications that require refrigeration or devices that need power.
- **Identify backup charging methods** for phones and keep hard copies of emergency numbers.
- **Build or restock your emergency kit** with flashlights, fresh batteries, first aid supplies and cash.
- **Know how to manually open** your garage door.




San Pablo Avenue Corridor Project: Please provide your input!
